General Description	-Located in Manoa, Honolulu area -Semester-based; no cohort program -Classes mostly day; may have evening options -Some scholarships/stipends may be available for high-need content areas.	-Classes to be held on the LCC campus (evening) -Quarter-based system (2 1/2 months in class; 2 weeks break in between sessions) -Year-round sessions -3 classes constitute full-time load; students with a 3.0 GPA or higher can take four (4) classes/quarter -All degrees can be completed completely online.

General Tips <i>Be sure to attend info sessions and meet with the university advisors prior to applying.</i>	-Plan to complete field experience and Praxis I (PPST) no later than the end of your first semester at UHM, preferably sooner. -Most Secondary Ed transfers will apply to the UHM COE B.Ed. Licensure Program <u>after</u> attending UHM for at least one semester (see UHM-COE advisor for content area courses needed for your emphasis area).	-Plan to complete your Praxis I (PPST) prior to entering Chaminade or at least by the end of your first quarter at Chaminade, if not sooner. -Refer to Chaminade’s <i>Hawaii Community Colleges Transfer Guide</i> to ensure you incorporate LCC’s general education courses that transfer to Chaminade.
